ARTISTS BIOGRAPHY

John Bauer is a South African Ceramicist with work in two national museums, who exhibits widely both locally and abroad.

He is best known for his challenging and unique neurology that creates fertile ground for innovation. He redefines the boundaries and possibilities of porcelain like reverse engineering a Tsung Dynasty technology, or inventing a printing technology on porcelain coined "dioroid" which works with a responsive emulsion infused in the body of clay to capture images of ambient objects.

He currently tiles buildings in kaleidoscopic matchbox tiles, each one unique, dubbed "people's museums".

When I go to museums and stand before artefacts, I am in awe, yet, I view well-crafted items in our daily lives as equally important.

The People's

Museum celebrates objects of people, condensing down the essence of everything in our life, trawling thrift stores and junk shops for textures that speak directly to our hearts.

With this project, I aim to create a tourism route around the city, much as people might follow Gaudi or Hundertwasser. Imagine all the jobs that would be created and all the prosperity surrounding these pieces.

These moments of tremendous inspiration erupting into my work are what I live for.






AN EMOTIONAL DICTIONARY
